

SERVICE & PUPIL PREMIUM

Background

Pupil Premium funding is provided by the Government to address the underlying inequalities between children receiving free school provision in comparison to those who are not in receipt of free school meals. In particular, it is a major concern that children who come from low income families are at a greater risk of under performing compared to children from families with a higher income.

Service Premium is funding provided by the Government to support service children. In the main, service children achieve very well at school. However, schools have recognised additional needs relating to service children's emotional and social well-being. Schools will be able to use the Service Premium to fund support in this area, as well as additional learning support, if they feel that it is appropriate.

In 2016/17 Solent has been allocated Service and Pupil Premium funding of £59,460.

Service and Pupil Premium Priorities for 2016 /17
To maintain the availability of before and after school ELSA drop in provision
To ensure that gains in attainment and progress in Maths are sustained
To provide one to one / small group tuition for children with gaps in learning
To provide writing support and intervention to ensure that all children meet age expected objectives
To ensure that weak readers are heard daily
To ensure all children are able to access activities and trips that enrich learning
